His grain sacrifice was not accepted because of his mind-set, not because it was not an animal sacrifice (see Le.5:11-13; 1:4-13; Nu.15:22-26).</p>	<p>1. The fear of man is put into the animals (v.2). 2. Man permitted to eat animals (prior man ate vegetables only) (v.3). 3. Capital punishment (v.6). 4. God promised not to flood the earth again by flood (v.8-17).</p> <p>FAILURE: Instead of obeying God by filling the earth, man disobeyed by staying together and building the Tower of Babel.</p> <p>JUDGEMENT: Confusion of the languages.</p>	<p>FAILURE: Man failed (Ro.10:1-3).</p>	<p>The Law is not soteriological, in fact, it displays the judicial character of God. Paul says the law was “the ministration of death” and “the ministration of condemnation” (2Co.3:7,9). Grace Displayed: 1. God’s unmerited favor electing Israel (Le.26:48; De.7:14-16). 2. God restored His sinning people (Je.31:20; Ho.2:19). 3. Giving the New Covenant (Je.31:32).</p>	<p>2 Aspects of Grace: 1. It is freely given. 2. It is for all.</p>	<p>The majority of mankind will reject Christ, and thus judgment will come on those living at that time.</p>	<p>Satan will be bound Disobedience will be quickly punished. At end of this age a revolt against Christ will be formed, but they will be unsuccessful (Re.20:7-9) and judged with everlasting punishment.</p>
