6	The commandments of God and the commandments of Jesus are two different things		Mt.5:21-43 “you have heard...but I say unto you” Mt.7:12 “Therefore, however you want people to treat you, so treat them, for this is the Law and the Prophets.”
7	Abraham obeyed God's 10 Commandments		Ge.26:5 “because Abraham obeyed Me and kept My charge, My commandments, My Statutes and My laws.” Ro.4 ²³ “not for his [Abraham] sake only was it written, that it was reckoned to him, ²⁴ but for our sake also...”
8	A “Commandment keeper” in the New Testament is one who keeps the 10 commandments		Mt.28:20 “Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you” Jn.14:15 “If you love me, keep my commandments” 1Jn.3:24 “He that keeps his commandments dwells in him, and he in him” (See Jn.14:21; 15:10; 1Co.7:19; 14:37; 1Th.4:2; 1 Jn.2:3-4; 3:22; 5:2; 2Jn.6; Re.14:12; 22:14)
9	The Christian is not required to “keep” the 10 commandments		Ga.3:17-25 ²⁴ “Therefore the Law has become our tutor to lead us to Christ, that we may be justified by faith. ²⁵ But now that faith has come, we are no longer under a tutor” Ga.5:18 “But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the Law.” Ro.6:14 “...for you are not under law, but under grace.” (See Co.2:20-23; Ac.15:1-29; 2Co.3:6-13)
10	The Christian is required to “keep” the 10 commandments		Ro.3:20 “for through the Law comes the knowledge of sin” Ja.2:10 “For whoever keeps the whole law and yet stumbles in one point, he has become guilty of all”
